- Open to sophomores and juniors
- Practice taking a college admissions standardized test
- First step in the National Merit Scholarship Program (for junior)
- \$15, checks made out to Logan-Rogersville Schools, PSAT in the memo
- October 19th, 7:30-12:00 in Lab 301
- 30 seats available
- Fee includes study guide and reserves spot

No fee for students & scores will be reportable for colleges & scholarships
