## Ozarks Technical Community College Honors Program: Benefits of the OTC Honors program:

Admission Guidelines: New OTC Students (less than 12 college hours) - Must meet 1 of the following criteria: ACT of 27 or above, or HS GPA of 3.75 or above, or COMPASS Reading score of 95 or above and Writing 98 or above, or GED score of 3100 or above. Students with 12 or more college hours (including dual credit) must have a 3.5 or above cumulative GPA on a minimum of 12 college credit hours. Applicants must fill out & submit the "Honors Program" application found on the webpage at

[www.otc.edu/futurestudents/honors.php](http://www.otc.edu/futurestudents/honors.php). Applicants must provide a letter of recommendation. The application deadline is July 1, 2012 for fall 2012 admission.

**Boys' State:** Boys' state provides understanding of government on different levels. All junior boys if you're interested in attending boys' state this summer write a brief paragraph telling why you would like to go. Your application fee will be paid for. It will be held June 16-23, 2012. Two boys will be elected to attend. Turn your paragraph into the Counselors' Office by **February 3, 2012.**

**Girls' State:** Girls' state is a week long study of government and Americanism training. All junior girls if you're interested in attending girls' state write a brief paragraph telling why you would like to go. Your application fee will be paid for. It will be held June 24-30, 2012. Turn your paragraph into the Counselors' Office by **February 3, 2012.**

**Missouri State University's Missouri Innovation Academy:** This program is for sophomore and junior high school students. The program is designed to encourage and help students to further explore and pursue postsecondary education degrees in innovative fields within science, technology, engineering, mathematics, and business. Students are introduced to collegiate opportunities in these career fields through activities and interactions with successful scientists, researchers, and businessmen. The academy will be held from June 10-30, 2012. Tuition for the academy is \$1500. Scholarships are available. **The**

**Missouri State University Department of Nursing's Nurse for a Day Workshop:** The workshop helps students better understand the field of Nursing. Students will have the opportunity to: Hear from a panel of former and current nursing students about the academic program and career field; participate in hands on activities in the MSU simulation labs; attend a presentation from the Nursing Admissions Coordinator-Academic Advisor about preparing for nursing school; and tour the MSU campus. To be eligible students must possess at least a 3.0 GPA or higher and provide a recommendation/reference from an academic teacher verifying the student's interest and academic potential (form is included in the informational packet). There will be 2 workshop dates for students to choose from. The first date is **Friday, March 9, 2012; the application deadline for the March 9 workshop is February 27, 2012.** The other workshop date is **March 30, 2012; the application deadline for the March 30 date is March 19, 2012.** The workshops are held from 8:30AM-3:30PM. Space is limited so registration for the workshop is on a first come, first serve basis. Go to the Counselors' Office for an application.

**Southwest Missouri Area Health Care Education Center's Ahc Career Enhancement Scholars (ACES) Program:** High school students with an intent to practice in primary health care is a requirement to be eligible for the program. Students must have a 3.0 GPA or higher on the 4.0 scale as well. Students will be able to experience: health professional shadowing, mentoring, workshops, regional forums, academic enrichment, community leadership, round tables, and statewide events.
